NOTICE OF NEW POLICY FOR THE FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

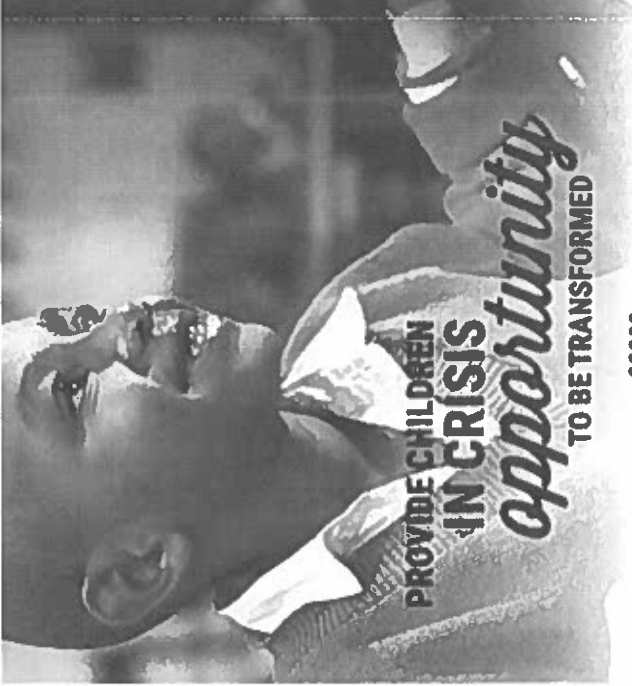
This notice is to inform everyone of the new policies regarding our Food Service Program. The State of Michigan has required all schools to create policies for both Meal Charging and School Meal Bad Debt. They have set guidelines for us to follow, and our School Board has approved the new policies to begin with the 2017-2018 school year.

Starting September 5, 2017, our policy for School Meal Charging will be as follows: Students must have a positive balance in their school meal account to charge a meal. This pre-payment of meals can be done by the week, the month, or in larger deposits. A daily payment can be made if your child only takes an occasional meal. A student without a positive balance will be able to charge up to three meals, and a written reminder to send a payment or a cold lunch will be sent home to parents.

The daily price for a full-price lunch is \$2.95, and a full-price breakfast costs \$1.45. If your child is a full-price student who takes hot lunch every day, an average monthly cost would be \$59, and the breakfast would be an additional \$29. Students who qualify for reduced-price lunch would pay \$8 per month, and \$6 per month for breakfast. Because this is our year of transition, we will work with all parents who have existing balances to meet their financial needs. However, we will require the pre-payment for the meals being eaten now, and an additional payment towards the existing balance. The amount of the additional payment will be worked out on an individual basis. Please call Marcy Messner to work out a mutually agreeable plan.

The School Board has also approved the School Meal Bad Debt Policy. Starting September 2017, that policy will be as follows: All uncollected balances referred to as "Bad Debt" will be billed to the parent monthly until they are deemed inactive/uncollectable. At that time, the hot lunch program will be reimbursed by the General Fund, and the accounts that fit the Board of Education's criteria for "Bad Debt" will be referred to a collection agency. Per State of Michigan requirements, this must be done by December 17th for the previous school year's account.

Thank you for taking the time to read this introductory letter. I want to briefly share with you what our organization is about and what we have to offer the community of Dollar Bay.

Child Evangelism Fellowship is a Bible-centered organization composed of born-again believers whose purpose is to evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and to establish (disciple) them in the Word of God and in a local church for Christian living. (excerpt from cefonline.com) Our two primary ministries are Good News Club and 5 Day Club(summer ministry).

Good News Club (GNC) is our school year ministry, and is for elementary age children. As of 2019, there was a GNC offered in 10 of the 15 counties in the UP. A GNC meets in the school building, after school, for one and a half hours, once a week. All children are welcome, regardless of religious belief, and may only attend with parental permission. Attendance is free and no donations are solicited. CEF partners with a local church near the school in which the Club is held, to provide mentoring to the children of that community.

Sometimes questions arise about the club's legality in light of it's Biblical basis and Christian viewpoint. On June 11, 2001, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that it is legal for public schools to allow Child Evangelism Fellowship to provide Good News Club as a means of after-school, Biblically-based character instruction for public school students. This decision stated that Bible Clubs must be given the same access to school facilities accorded any other non-school related outside group. Also, no superintendent, principal, or teacher is breaking the law by participating in GNC after school hours in his or her private capacity.

In short, Good News Club...

1. Is a voluntary club led by caring citizens from local churches using curriculum produced by CEF.
2. Is FREE to the school, parents, children, and community.
3. Has curriculum that teaches Biblical moral values, character qualities such as honesty, self-control, working hard, and respect for authority.
4. Has volunteer leaders who have all received specialized yearly training and criminal background screening.
5. Is covered by a \$3 million liability insurance policy.
6. Requires each participating child to have a guardian-signed Student Registration Form

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Annual Summer Tax Resolution

Dollar Bay-Tamarack City Area Schools, Houghton County, Michigan (the "District")

A meeting of the board of education of the District (the "Board") was held in the _____, within the boundaries of the District, on the 17th day of October, 2022, at _____ o'clock in the ____m. (the "Meeting").

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member _____ and supported by Member _____:

WHEREAS, this Board previously adopted a resolution to impose a summer tax levy to collect 100% (*Choose 50% or 100%*) of annual school property taxes, including debt service, upon property located within the District and continuing from year-to-year until specifically revoked by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Pursuant to the Revised School Code, MCL 380.1 et seq., the Board invokes for 2023 its previously adopted ongoing resolution imposing a summer tax levy of 100% (*Choose 50% or 100%*) of annual school property taxes, including debt service, upon property located within the District and continuing from year-to-year until specifically revoked by the Board and requests that each city and/or township in which the District is located collect those summer taxes.

2. The Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to forward to the governing body of each city and/or township in which the District is located a copy of this Board's resolution imposing a summer property tax levy on an ongoing basis and a copy of this resolution requesting that each such city and/or township agree to collect the summer tax levy for 2023 in the amount specified in this resolution. Such forwarding of the resolutions and the request to collect the summer tax levy shall be performed so that they are received by the governing bodies on or before December 31, 2022.

3. Pursuant to and in accordance with Revised School Code Section 1613, the Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to negotiate on behalf of the District with the governing body of each city and/or township in which the District is located for the reasonable expenses for collection of the District's summer tax levy that the city and/or township may bill under Revised School Code Sections 1611 or 1612. Any such proposed agreement shall be brought before this Board for its approval or disapproval.

4. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are rescinded.
